£3.2 MILLION FOR BECKENHAM

Bromley Council's second bid to the Transport for London (TfL) Major Improvements Fund has been successful. £3.2 million will be invested in Beckenham to improve our town centre, with a focus on improving the balance between cars, bicycles and pedestrians.

Over the coming months the Council will be revisiting the design concept and consulting local people. The LBB Council led Working Group will be reinstated and, of course, the Copers Cope Area Resident's' Association will attend and keep you updated. Let us have your suggestions for how the money should be sent, and we will put them to the Working Group on your behalf.

SOUTHEND ROAD AND HIGH STREET JUNCTION

Transport for London are funding some works to realign the junction at Southend Road/Rectory Road/Albemarle Road/High Street.

LBB Council Officers have drawn up the plans which will see the pavement outside O'Neill's pub reduced and the traffic island moved over so vehicles turning from Rectory Road on to the bridge will have more road and a wider turning area to get around the corner. This should avoid them either mounting the pavement outside the Locksmiths or getting stuck because their vehicles are too big to make the turn.

Beckenham's Town Centre Team met with LBB Council Officers to discuss the design and the following points were noted:

- LBB have re-checked the scheme (at the request of the Copers Cope Residents' Association) and the pavement cannot be widened outside the Locksmiths as doing so would mean lorries would not have enough room to turn and would continue to mount the pavement.
- LBB have agreed to improve pedestrian access turning the corner from Rectory Road to Southend Road by resurfacing the pavement, investigating whether the lamp column outside the Locksmiths can be removed to improve the visibility for pedestrians turning the corner, to monitor whether the bollards and dumb-bells can be removed safely to improve the width of the pavement and increase visibility turning the corner for pedestrians.

- Whether railings would be better than bollards was raised. LBB advised railings are dangerous to cyclists (getting squashed against them by vehicles) and the gap required between the railing and the outer edge of the pavement would reduce the pavement width even further.
- It was asked whether a front Cycle Box should be included in the redesign, LBB Officers advised that current Bromley Council Policy did not use them. It was noted that this may be out of step with the Mayor's plan for Cycling in London.
- Concerns over the short time given to pedestrians to cross at the lights and the viability of a diagonal crossing were raised. LBB Officers advised that the times for crossing junctions were set on a national walking speed of 1.2 metres per second and could not be increased. Regarding a diagonal crossing, LBB Officers explained how the longer crossing time would have a detrimental effect on traffic flow and so was not viable at this busy junction.
- LBB Officers advised that countdown timers would be installed on the pedestrian lights to make it easier for pedestrians to cross.

No timetable for the work has been announced, it is still in planning stages, we will keep you updated.

TOWN CENTRE TEAM FOR BECKENHAM



Local groups are on a mission to improve and promote Beckenham. Last year a Town Centre Team was set up to bring together Beckenham community groups, businesses, local residents and the London Borough of Bromley to focus on the vitality and betterment of Beckenham Town Centre.

The small Team, put together by the Copers Cope Area Residents' Association, Beckenham Business Association and the Council Town Centre Manager for Beckenham, is a collaboration of local community groups. This forum for local groups raises issues, shares ideas and work together with Bromley Council to realise those ideas.

Currently the TCT is working on the following projects: decluttering the High Street of unnecessary street furniture and signage; providing input on the Southend Road and High Street Junction Redesign, improving amenities for Beckenham Green, repair of the Town Clocks, improvements to High Street alleyways, obtaining the Purple Flag Award

for the night time economy, and identifying safety, accessibility and streetscape improvements for the Town Centre. Over the coming months the TCT will focus on the £3.2 million public realm improvements for Beckenham and has already compiled a list of proposals (raised within the community) for Bromley Council and their design consultants to consider.

The current Chair of the TCT from the Copers Cope Residents' Association said, "Local groups and stakeholders have been very supportive of the TCT, we have representatives from a variety of local groups who are all keen to roll their sleeves up to take forward ideas and get things done in Beckenham. The Team is small, but the reach is wide, as each representative feeds back to their own organisation, this gives us a wealth of ideas and resources. We are especially pleased to be working with Waitrose who have offered their Community Volunteer Scheme for TCT projects and provided us with a meeting space. Now the TCT is in full swing you can expect to hear more from it."

HERITAGE TREES



Beckenham's Heritage Trees have been under threat in recent years, a number have been lost due to development or subsidence claims. Not all our heritage trees are under a Tree Preservation Order or in a Conservation Area, whereby an application must be made to the Council to fell or pollard them.

In the coming months the Copers Cope Area Residents' Association will be working with resident groups and LBB Council to survey roads in our ward and mark trees to be

considered for a Tree Preservation Order.

This will involve walking our roads and cul de sacs with Council maps and marking out any great specimens that have a significant impact on the surrounding area.

LOCAL RESIDENT BRINGS THE BEAR BACK TO BECKENHAM



Congratulations to film director Petros Silvestros whose short film MIKE is the first ever British film to win a Crystal Bear at the Berlin International Film Festival! MIKE was shot in Beckenham High Street and Antonio's Male Grooming Salon last summer. We caught up with Beckenham resident, Petros, who has just returned from Berlin.

Petros, many congratulations on such a fantastic achievement! How does it feel to bring the Bear home to Beckenham? I am very happy about it and very proud that we are the first British film to win it. Berlin film festival is the second biggest festival in the world and gets inundated by thousands of submissions, so winning it makes us also feel very special. We are also very excited from the fact that this win gives us now good chances for a Bafta or an Oscar nomination.

What inspired you to choose Beckenham and Antonio's salon as a film location? We chose Beckenham High Street because we wanted a simple, down to earth, anonymous London town and a high street with a curve. Moreover Antonio's salon combined the right shape and space and by tweaking its decoration, we gave it the suitable style to serve the mood of the film.

When will the public be able to see the film? The film will hopefully have its UK premiere later this year either in Edinburgh or Raindance Film Festival. After that, there will be a few screenings in central London and then it will get broadcast on TV. We hope that later this year we will arrange a screening in Beckenham as well. Any words of advice for budding filmmakers? Tips and advice vary so much depending on who you are and what you want to achieve. So the only general advice I can give is simply don't listen too much to any advice, even if it comes from Spielberg. Do question all the "musts" and experts' guidelines and create your own path. As Frank Capra wisely said: Don't follow trends, start them.

What's next for you? I have two scripts for a feature film in the pipeline, one is a thriller and the other one a science fiction. On the other hand, the film business is always so unpredictable and you never know what might be next.

Best of luck and we hope that MIKE continues to do well at the festivals this season. We look forward to seeing it on the silver screen some day!



BECKENHAM BEACON / PEDEATRIC SERVICES MAY MOVE



The Copers Cope Area Residents' Association has been attending the Beckenham Beacon Project - Patient Group which has now come to an end.

Unfortunately there is still little to report. Over the past few months the Bromley Clinical Commissioning Group undertook a Needs Assessment of the whole borough to assess the health needs of the population requiring services from Beckenham Beacon to inform future commissioning intentions. The Patient Group was expected to comment on the Needs Assessment in regard to what service should be located at the Beacon from a patient perspective. This was difficult to do as the Group did not have information the options of services available and the space and financial implications of them. We raised transport, accessibility, appointments for phlebotomy, extended hours for urgent care and radiology. We have asked for the Patient Group to be extended into the next phases of the project where viable options will be considered.

In regard to the Needs Assessment for the Beckenham Area it was noted that the wards of Bromley Town, Clock House, Copers Cope and Kelsey & Eden Park has a much higher population of under 5s. Despite this Kings College (who run the Beacon and the PRUH) are proposing moving Paediatric Services out of the Beacon and only offering them and PRUH only, the rationale for this being that operating out of two sites is difficult in terms of consultant cover. We advised we expected significant resistance to this proposal from local people given that Beckenham is full of young families and the PRUH is difficult to travel to especially with sick children. Noting the Beacon deals with over 40% of paediatric attendances within the borough, the Patient Group requested that Kings provide more information on the levels and ratios of consultant cover required to deliver a safe and effective service both at Beacon and the PRUH.

Concerned residents may wish to talk to their GPs and practitioners.

PLANNING AND LICENSING UPDATE

There is not much to report for planning or licensing since the last Express.

The new flats behind Pierluigi's continue to be built. There are delays at the Dylon Site on Worsley Bridge Road. A report is expected from the four day Public Enquiry held early in February to examine the Council's refusal of a revised application which would replace agreed office space in Block A03 with 74 residential units. Development on the Beckenham Kent County Cricket Ground started a short while before Christmas but progress must be difficult in view of all the rain. The most recent Appeal against refusal for development behind 32 Church Avenue was dismissed following a Hearing on 7th January.

There have been a number of applications that involve turning office space into residential (usually studios and bedsits). There is a worry that losing too much office space could have a detrimental affect on the vibrancy of the High Street - office workers boost the lunchtime trade. Unfortunately there is little the Council can do to stop this due to changes to Government legislation. On 30 May 2013 the General Permitted Development Order was amended to grant new rights to change from office to residential use for a 3 year period. Such changes no longer require planning permission. Of course we still continue to monitor planning applications for the new layout to ensure the new housing is of good quality and not too dense.

IF YOU GO DOWN TO THE WOODS TODAY... YOU'LL DISCOVER A LOCAL GEM



Walk a few paces into the woods on the corner of Westgate Road and Beckenham Place Park and you'll find The Foxgrove Club, a community members' club in a truly magical setting.

As a family new to Beckenham, we recently discovered and have fast come to cherish this place. It is where we first met our neighbours, where we still get sound local advice. This is where we relax with the weekend papers, where we enjoy evenings of competitive quiz banter and exceptional live music. You'd be surprised by the local and international talent that regularly rocks The Foxgrove Club, from jazz to blues to West End tunes.

So what's the story? Well, entertainment and good Shephard Neame beer are guaranteed, but sadly the maintenance of the Club's once glorious building is not. Back in 1906, local residents approached the owners of Cator Estate, as the park was then known, with an idea to build a clubhouse. By 1907, those local residents, not so dissimilar to you and I, had built The Foxgrove. Maintenance of the building has been funded through the club's membership ever since.

Frank, resident manager of the club since 1978, told us; "We have many of the ledgers dating back to 1907. This was a grand and enviable place to be a member of. It was formal attire only. Today, we have a much more relaxed atmosphere, we welcome everybody even in their muddy boots."

We asked Frank about the state of the building today, he told us; "It's simple. We need new members, and lots of them, if we're to get the building back to former glory. We need local people to know about the place, to come and be part of the club, it's an enjoyable thing to do after all."



It's true. There aren't many places where you feel comfortable going on your own for a chat on a weekday lunchtime, or that will welcome the kids after a soggy woodland walk. But then, The Foxgrove Club is a unique kind of place; it is a place where the under 6's chatter with the over 60's and members of every age in between relax too.



This is a precious place from a bygone era and it needs local support, some attention and protection against a possible future of vacancy then certain vandalism.

So, do go down to the woods today... Take a punt, open the door (that admittedly needs a lick of paint) and go in for a pint, a glass of wine or a squash for the kids. We hope, like us, you'll come to cherish this local gem of a place.

The SNP has been renamed to the Community Advisory Panel (CAP), although, the term Safer Neighbourhoods will also remain in use. Under the new system for local policing Wards are unchanged but are now in clusters. The Copers Cope area comes within the north west borough cluster together with Shortlands, Crystal Palace, Kelsey, Eden Park, Clockhouse and Penge. This Ward's team still operates out of the Albemarle Road office.

There is a move to employing predictive crime mapping, maintaining crime prevention/reduction as a high priority using a proactive and high visibility approach.

A second name change is from Ward Priorities to Ward Promises - as before, up to three areas of crime will be set for our local police to focus on over the weeks between the Panel meetings.

On 16th January the Promises were set as (a) Serious acquisitive crime (SAC) and (b) driving offences. Just two were set this time because SAC includes all types of burglary and robbery, and driving offences covers a range of issues, from using mobile phone while driving, not wearing seatbelts, through to speeding and bad practice at zebra crossings, etc.

A local resident had asked for traffic issues around the entrance to Ella Close (off Rectory Road) to be raised by the CCARA representative. This was duly discussed, and the local Sergeant agreed to make observations, including speed testing the stretch of road.
