

### **BECKENHAM PUBLIC TOILETS WILL CLOSE**

Despite objections from the Copers Cope Residents' Association, West Beckenham Residents' Association, the Beckenham Business Association, The Beckenham Society, 80 direct objections from residents and a petition of over 700 local residents, Council Executives voted to close the Beckenham public toilets at Thornton's Corner and offer the building for sale or to demolish it.



We received many comments from local people opposing closure of the public toilets in Beckenham. main concern was that the existing community Toilet Scheme was not adequate and that some of the additional Community

Toilets offered were not in the High Street. Many told us they would be happy to pay for the toilets through increased Council Tax. Some residents were also concerned what would become of the building and surrounding flower beds.

We passed your feedback on to the Council and also asked the Council to defer making a decision on the toilets until all the relevant information (ie the true cost of running them and how often they are used) was researched so that local people could decide if they were value for money. We also urged them to consider other options, such as reducing the space the toilets take up in the building by one third and commercially letting the remainder to pay for the maintenance of the toilets.

# **Asset of Community Value**

The Copers Cope Area Residents' Association has been successful in its application to have the Beckenham public toilets listed as an Asset of Community Value. This means that, should the Council decide to sell the building they must offer time for the community to come up with a bid for the building when it is sold.

We will ask the Council to transfer the Asset at negligible cost so it can be repurposed for use for the community. Hopefully our Councillors and the Council Executive will support this request.

# SUNDAY SERVICE ON 352 AND 354 BUSES FROM SEPTEMBER 2015



The Copers Cope Area Residents' Association have been working closely with the organisers of the '354 on a Sunday Campaign'. As well as jointly, with West Beckenham Residents' Association setting up a '352 on a Sunday Petition' and lobbying James Cleverly (Greater London Authority) for a Sunday service on both the 352 and 354.

Mr Cleverly's office has provided us confirmation that TfL "Have recently awarded new contracts for the operation of routes 352 and 354. As part of the contract award and subject to the outcome of formal consultation (which will commence in May 2015), we are proposing that both routes will run on Sundays and Public Holidays, with a provisional start date of September 2015". This is great news for Beckenham bus users. We will let you know when the consultation is available for local people to comment.


# BECKENHAM TOWN CENTRE TEAM (TCT)

# **Alleyway Naming Project**

The final names for the Alleyways have been chosen. Thank you to everyone that got in touch. We would especially like to thank Bromley Road School and Beckenham's heritage community for their contribution. The final names are shown below.



Bid for London Mayor's High Street Fund

The Copers Cope Area Resident's Association on behalf of the Town Team put forward a bid for £25,000 from the London Mayor's High Street Fund. Our bid is a project called 'Do Up Our Alleys' and it can be found online at https://spacehive.com/doupouralley

If successful the High Street Fund monies will be used to improve the alleyways by clearing up the rubbish, installing lighting and signage, improving footway surfaces and decoration. This will free up monies in the Council's small short-term improvement budget to undertake projects not covered by the TfL major Beckenham Town Centre Improvements. Such as installing a permanent stage cover on The Green for community events, fixing the town's clocks and heritage water pump.

# **Improvements on Beckenham Green**

The TCT has been working with the Council and design consultants East on the specifications of a permanent stage cover for Beckenham Green, a storage unit and water tap.

# **Purple Flag**

The Copers Cope Residents' Association and Town Team is working with the Council on attaining Purple Flag status for Beckenham's night time economy. There is a long way to go to satisfy the criteria to get the Flag; we will keep you updated as milestones are met. The Purple Flag is an accreditation process similar to Green Flag Award for parks and Blue Flag for beaches. It leads to Purple Flag status for town centres that meet or surpass the standards of excellence in managing the evening and night-time economy. It has a comprehensive set of standards and good practice examples designed to help transform town and city centres at night. ### BECKENHAM TOWN CENTRE IMPROVEMENTS




The Copers Cope Area Residents' Association continues to attend the Council-led Working Party to represent residents. The concept designs are still largely the same


whilst the survey (utility survey, topographical surveys and detailed traffic modelling) results are due to come in. We are expecting progressed scheme designs imminently and have invited the design consultants East to present the most up-to -date scheme at our AGM and Public Meeting at 8.15pm on 18th March 2015 at the Beckenham Public Halls. This meeting is open to all local residents.

The Rectory Road, South End Road, Albemarle Road Junction works have begun as, after a long wait, BT are moving their services beneath the road to allow the works to progress.

Ideas for the War Memorial and roundabout were discussed at the last Working Group. As you know, the Copers Cope Area Residents' Association have fought to ensure that improvements to the roundabout are part of the TfL public realm improvements, we are pleased that the consultants are progressing to design ideas. There are 5 ideas, the options are shown below. (The building at the top is the Post Office, to its right the Cinema.)



Option 1: Relocate the War Memorial, remove roundabout, widen footways, and install traffic lights.





Option 2: Relocate the War Memorial, remove roundabout, create public space outside cinema, widen footways, and install traffic lights.



Option 3: War Memorial in same location, adjust size and shape of roundabout, create informal crossing outside cinema that make roundabout look more visually connected to the pavement outside the cinema

Option 4: War Memorial in same location, pavement on corner of High Street and Croydon Road (by Hisar Meze Bar) increased to include War Memorial so new small mini roundabout created





Option 5: Keep existing layout of the War Memorial and roundabout, new landscaping around memorial, slight widening of pavement outside cinema, investigate informal crossing outside cinema that makes roundabout look more visually connected to the pavement

The final option would be to do nothing, which seems a wasted opportunity.

Our preference is option 5 as the existing roundabout works well, the location of the War Memorial within it is majestic and serves as a prominent local landmark, but new landscaping is in dire need to improve this end of the High Street, and new paving to create an informal crossing that encourages cars to slow down so pedestrians have a proper point to cross to the memorial is worth investigating.

We are not keen on options 1, 2 and 3 and they require traffic lights instead of a roundabout. Option 4 is an interesting idea however a larger roadway with a higher speed smaller roundabout does not seem an improvement on the existing set up. # **Network Rail Improvements to Beckenham Junction Station**

Network Rail have agreed to make some improvements to Beckenham Junction Station. They would like to increase the size of the foyer area by building a brick and glass extension on to the front of the station to give a



larger ticket hall, improved shops, and somewhere to wait for a pickup inside from the rain

The inside of the new structure will give more space and large entrances to the original ticket hall.



We asked Network Rail consider making the whole construction from glass noting it would be difficult to match new brick with the existing brickwork of the station. We have also asked that they look at improving the Waitrose side exit and install a ticket machine on that side.

### PLANNING AND LICENSING UPDATE

# 200 year old London Plane Tree on The Avenue to be felled

In September 2012 the Copers Cope Residents' Association assisted in getting the beautiful Plane tree on The Avenue under a Tree Protection Order. Unfortunately Bromley Council gave permission for the tree to be felled on the 5th February 2015.

The tree is suspected of contributing to subsidence under a nearby house. Local people have fought hard to ensure that there is conclusive evidence that the tree is actually the cause of the subsidence. There have been numerous technical reports by the house insurer's consultants over the last few years, none of which have been conclusive. Even the Council's own independent report does not recommend felling the tree, stating that the findings of the insurer's consultant reports are inconclusive and incomplete.

We are gravely disappointed that the Council chose not to follow its own professional consultant's advice, instead recommending consent to be granted for the removal of this tree based on the insurer's reports.

Heritage trees are an intrinsic part of the character of many roads in Northern Beckenham. Because of the detrimental effect the felling of a healthy tree has on the character of the area it should be an action of last resort.

Beckenham's Heritage Trees have been under threat in recent years, with a number lost due to development or subsidence claims such as this. Not all our heritage trees are under a Tree Preservation Order, whereby you must apply to the Council to fell or pollard them, and the ones that are not covered by a TPO are more at risk. If you have an old or mature tree in your road, why not contact the Council to see if it is covered by a Tree Preservation Order, and if not whether it should be. # Former Dylon International Ltd site

The proposed development at the former Dylon International Ltd site beset by planning issues since 2007 looks set to move forward. In January 2015 there was an agreement at appeal that the development could go ahead with less office space than was originally given planning permission for. The report notes that the future of the area cannot be guaranteed to provide employment and therefore an effective return on investment in building office space, so it is now sensible to allow additional housing provision in this block. An earlier disagreement regarding developer's

contributions for education, healthcare and affordable housing has also been fixed. We will keep you posted as the development progresses.

# **Other Planning News**

- 83 Copers Cope Road the scheme was recommended for approval by the case officer but was deferred at Committee. The developer, The Oakwood Group, have launched an appeal which LBB have contested. The scheme will now be the subject of review by the Planning Inspectorate.
- Old Ardec Shop the scheme for a two storey rear extension to provide additional retail floorspace at ground floor and a one bedroom flat at first floor level has been refused. The applicant has since made a new application for a ground floor extension to the shop only.
- Tudor Manor on Beckenham Place Park the proposal for demolition of existing dwelling and construction of 3 five bedroom two-storey detached dwelling houses with integral garages has been refused.
- 24 High Street above St Christopher's Hospice shop an application has been made for one two-bedroom and one one-bedroom flat.

# HERITAGE WATER FOUNTAIN RESTORED

The Copers Cope Residents Association has been asking for the water fountain in Kelsey Square to be restored for many years. It was also firmly on the agenda for the Town Centre Team too. It was a welcome sight to see the tradesman hard a work a couple of weeks ago. All that perseverance has paid off the fountain is now restored.

### **LOTTERY SCAM**

A lottery scam takes place when criminals pretend you've won a prize in a lottery. Those most likely to fall victim to this tend to be over the age of 60 and it's often family members of victims who spot the tell-tale signs of fraud. Criminals normally make contact by letter or email and try to engage in dialogue. Once you are convinced they are "genuine", they ask for payment of a fee to release your winnings. This fee, they say, could be to pay taxes or duty, or for a solicitor, banker or judge to authorise the transaction. Often, this first fee will be small but, once they know you are willing to pay, they ask for more and more money, with ever-changing excuses as to why they need it. Victims can end up losing tens of thousands of pounds. No genuine Lottery will ever ask for any sort of fee to be paid.

You may be surprised this type of crime succeeds. Why would anyone fall prey to a scam like this when they never entered any lottery in the first place? Why would they pay money when they are supposed to have won millions? The truth is these criminals are very persuasive and prey on people who are trusting. Therefore, even if you know you would not be defrauded like this, please spread the message to others in your community to simply delete e-mails which detail you winning money or being in a position to make a fortune.
