## REPORT BACK FROM MEMBERS MEETING 20 OCTOBER 2025

On 20 October CCARA and WBRA held the annual “meet your Councillors” event at Christ Church on Fairfield Road, providing an opportunity for members to put questions to a panel of their local councillors.

Councillors on the panel were Jessica Arnold (Clock House), Will Connolly (Beckenham Town and Copers Cope), Christine Harris (Kelsey and Eden Park) and Tom Turrell, member of the Greater London Assembly. Also present were Cllr Michael Tickner.

Issues raised by members included:

- Need for cameras on some roads eg Copers Cope Road to deter speeding vehicles
- Council tax on empty properties unable to be occupied because of cladding issues
- Accessibility for disabled people in Beckenham and in the NHS
- Kelsey Park bridges
- Pest control of foxes
- Crystal Palace swimming pool refurbishment.
- Scruffy shop fronts and empty shops

## THE BECKENHAM PAROCHIAL CHARITY

Have you heard of the Beckenham Parochial Charity (BPC)? The BCP has supported residents in Beckenham and Penge for over 300 years, providing housing and financial help to those in need.



Today, its work focuses on three areas: almshouse accommodation (six homes in Beckenham and three in West Wickham), educational grants for children and young people, and financial support for individuals and families facing hardship.

Formed from seven historic local endowments, the earliest ones, the charities of 'Edmund Style and others' and , the charity known as 'Anthony Rawlin's Almshouses' dating back to 1694, BPC is run by local trustees and continues to play an important role in the community.

## BECKENHAM GREEN FRIENDS

The Friends have been busy on The Green over the winter and early spring months. Alongside general tidying, work has focused on improving key areas, including the corner opposite M&S, where overgrowth such as castor oil plants has been pruned back to create a neater appearance. Attention is also being given to improving the compost area.



The Friends have also provided feedback to Bromley Council on how both the Council and idverde (the Council's parks contractor) could better support parks' friends groups.

A key suggestion is the development of an agreed green space management plan, created collaboratively between idverde and local friends groups or stakeholders, to reflect the specific needs of each space. For The Green, this would include areas such as grass and path maintenance, lighting, litter control, ideas for more recreational use, and longer-term plans to improve both usage and appearance.

## POLICE STATION FRONT COUNTER IN BROMLEY

You may have seen recent media reports about changes to 24-hour police station front counters across London. The Metropolitan Police is adjusting opening hours at most front counters to help address a £260m funding shortfall. According to the Met, fewer than 1 in 2,000 crimes since 2012 have been reported at police stations during overnight hours (10pm–10am on weekdays and 7pm–9am on weekends). Under the new arrangements, London will retain two 24-hour police front counters, located in Lewisham and Charing Cross.



**Bromley Police Station** front counter is not closing. The current plan is for it to open from 10am to 10pm Monday to Friday, and 9am to 7pm at weekends. For now, the front counter continues to operate as usual. A further announcement will be made when the revised opening hours are due to come into effect.

## RETURN OF THE 'BECKENHAM LACE'

For years the 'Beckenham Lace' has been housed in Bromley Central Library, but with Central Library moving to the former Top Shop store in Bromley High Street, the community asked for the Beckenham Lace to be returned to Beckenham.

The fabulously detailed lace panel, created in Nottingham, depicting the Battle of Britain has now been installed in Beckenham Library. The display notes are shown below, we have let the Council know that it needs to be updated with its new display location.

### **Battle of Britain Lace Panel**

This lace panel was created in the mid 1940s by a Nottingham-based lace-making company, Dobson & Browne, as a commemoration of the Battle of Britain (1940). Their company name is visible at the top of the panel. 38 lace panels were made and given to individuals, organisations and countries to honour their significant contributions during the Battle of Britain.



This particular panel was presented to the Borough of Beckenham in 1947 by the makers. It was requested by local resident, Henry Norman Smith, MP for Nottingham South. He wrote to the Municipal Borough of Beckenham and offered a commemorative lace panel to the council on

behalf of Dobson & Browne, to commemorate one of the towns at the forefront of the Battle of Britain.

On 1st April 1965, Beckenham became part of the new London Borough of Bromley. Five years later on 7th April 1970, the panel was given by the Mayor of Bromley (Alderman C.H.E. Pratt) to the commandant at Royal Air Force Biggin Hill for safe keeping, and as an expression of the gratitude of the civic authority to the Royal Air Force station which had 'such an outstanding and historic part in the Battle of Britain' (from the bronze plaque commemorating the transfer of the lace panel in 1970). Following the closure of the officers' mess, the lace was placed in the custody of Bromley Council, and is now on display here at Bromley Central Library.

The lace panel is full of imagery taken from the Battle of Britain; allied and enemy aircraft in battle, airmen parachuting out of the sky, and bomb damaged buildings including the House of Commons, Buckingham Palace and Guildhall are all visible. Perhaps most iconic is St Paul's Cathedral, shown



surrounded by flames but untouched by the bombing occurring all around it. At the top of the panel the badges of the Air Forces of New Zealand, Canada, Australia, and South Africa are depicted, highlighting the diversity of those who flew and fought in the conflict. Below them the words 'The Battle of Britain' are ablaze. Along the edges and at the bottom of the panel are the national flowers of the British Isles. A scroll across the very bottom contains a quote from Winston Churchill's 1940 speech: 'Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few.'

**Geof Slater**, former WBRA President, died last October aged 92. Geof was Vice-President and President between 1994 and 2011. He stepped down when he could no longer attend meetings, though he kept in touch and wrote to us on matters that concerned him. His working life was spent, from 1953, in London Transport, where, in his role as Traffic Manager on the central line, he won an award from the Royal Humane

Society for rescuing a person trapped under a train. Outside of work he was a keen gardener, tennis player and cribbage player. In his retirement he travelled extensively around the British Isles – always on public transport!

**Michael (Mikey) Dowler**, our well loved street cleaner sadly died unexpectedly last December. Mikey was a familiar sight on Beckenham High Street, and you may have seen a memorial to him at Thornton's Corner last December. He was always cheerful and very proud of his work in keeping our High Street clean and tidy. He is much missed by his colleagues and the wider community.



## 54 BUS TIME CHANGES



Transport for London (TfL) has confirmed changes to the 54 bus service (Elmers End to Woolwich), effective from Saturday 2 May. On weekdays between 5:50am and 8:00pm, buses will run every 12 minutes, compared to the current frequency of every 10 minutes. There are no changes to evening or weekend services.

We are fortunate that our High Street continues to regenerate quickly. Aside from the building that houses The Gas Fireplace, where there are currently two long-term vacant shopfront, formerly Risto Restaurant and Remel's children's store.

### **Kebab Ye and SAS Holdings**

(formerly Thackray Williams) recently displayed auction signs,

which have now been removed. We hope this indicates that the buildings have been successfully sold, and we look forward to seeing how they will be redeveloped.

There has also been activity inside the former **Musical Images** shopfront. We understand that a veterinary practice may be opening there, with **Creature Comforts Vets** indicating a new store planned for Beckenham in summer 2026.

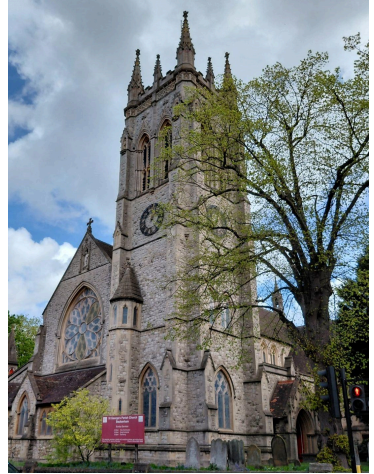

## ST GEORGE'S CHURCH BECKENHAM 25/03569

The application for changes to St George's Church in Beckenham addresses the growing demand for facilities by the congregation and the numerous large events hosted by the church throughout the year. This includes the urgent need for additional toilets to adequately accommodate event attendees, as well as the installation of a servery to provide refreshments.



The project aims to introduce a self-contained multifunctional space, for the use of the parish and accessible to various community groups, intended to cater to the diverse needs of the community and to serve as a source of revenue to sustain ongoing maintenance of the church. The additional toilets and meeting room will be located in a new extension, while the servery will be accommodated by reconfiguring the north aisle, including the removal of 9 rows of pews. Furthermore, the proposal includes the reopening of the west door to ensure safe and convenient access for staff from the High Street into the church.

Although a medieval church stood on this site, it was entirely rebuilt from 1885-7 to designs by W. Gibbs Bartleet, retaining some historic monuments and features



internally. The Choir vestry was added to the north in 1890 and the tower completed 1902-3. The proposals were drawn up after extensive consultations including Rochester Diocesan Advisory Committee, Bromley Council, the Victorian Society, the Church Buildings Council, and Historic England.

The proposed changes to access within St. George's Church will significantly enhance safety, flow, and fire exit from the premises. Reinstating the original entrance, while not providing step-free access, will facilitate staff entry into the church and restore an original feature, contributing to the building's historical authenticity. It is important to note that the doorway and door leaves are already in place, and the proposals include internal rearrangements to expose the existing steps and restore the functionality of the door.

### **Orion School Balmoral Avenue 16/03145 - Appeal**

This application, to extend the use of the football pitch and Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) for community use up to 9.30pm weekdays and 4.30pm at weekends, was refused by LB Bromley, but the applicants have appealed. Over 100 people live in close proximity to the pitches. Rear bedrooms are likely to be used by children whose bedtimes are likely to be before the cut off times.

The Planning Inspector has visited the school and residents' homes, and said we could expect a decision in weeks rather than months. Residents were surprised to find both pitches used at the end of January. Helpfully, they recorded the noise and light pollution levels, but the Inspector refused to view it.



### **72-74 High Street, BR3 1ED 25/04491**

A planning application for the addition of a roof extension to the property located above Yammass restaurant has been refused. The two floors above the restaurant are currently occupied by flats. The proposal involved a full-width roof extension, converting the existing pitched roof to a flat roof.

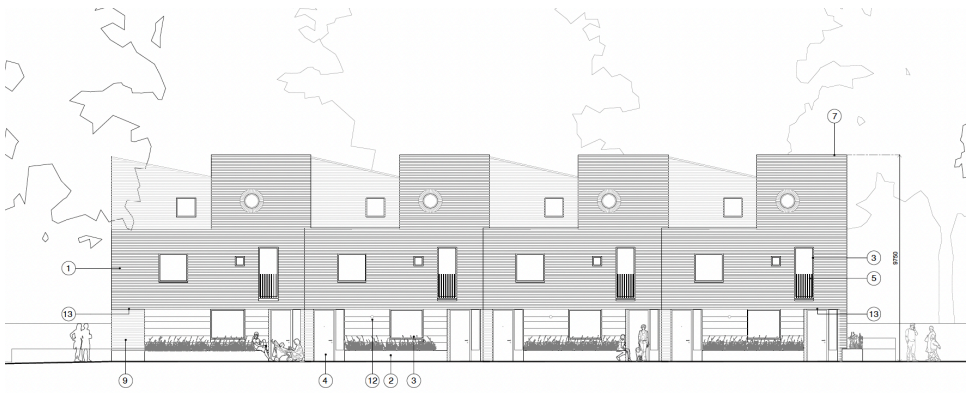
Two flats were proposed for the addition. Reasons for refusal were that the scheme was a bulky, unsympathetic and discordant form of development, harmful to the character and appearance of the property and terrace; it would fail to preserve or enhance the character and appearance of the Beckenham Town Centre Conservation Area; the external rear staircase would be detrimental to the outlook from the flats on the floor below; the design of the proposed flats would create a sub-standard and cramped form of accommodation because of the inadequate unit sizes and layout.

The building is currently scaffolded, with a temporary roof and the upper floors concealed with protective sheeting.

### **Land to the rear of 134-158 High Street, BR3 1EA 25/05159**

The Council are currently considering an application for a new housing development on the land behind the parade of shops that includes Erins bar and Tapeo restaurant. The application comprises four ground floor flats, and four maisonettes above. The design works well on a difficult and tight site, however access to the development is awkward: the entrance is via the alley off the High Street, by Card Factory shop, and opens right next to the pedestrian crossing. This is the only means of access to the development so refuse trucks and delivery vans will be required to cross the High Street pavement manoeuvre down this narrow lane (shown on the right, on the plan below).





### **Land outside 165 to 169, High Street 26/00373**

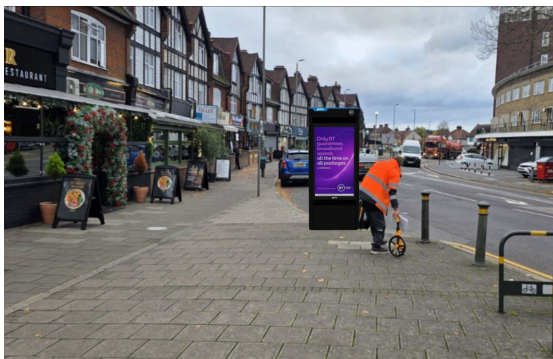
An application has been made for the installation of a BT Street hub unit on the pavement near the junction of the High Street and Village Way. The unit has digital advertising screens on both sides and has public wi-fi, keypad for making free phone calls and can display community and emergency messaging. Several residents have raised the problem of similar units adding to street clutter and obstructions to pavements.



### **Land outside 171 to 173, High Street 26/00382**

An application has also been made for a similar Street Hub slightly further down the road, outside the British Red Cross shop. It isn't clear if these are alternative proposed locations or if both would be installed, if approved.

**308-310 Croydon Road, BR3 4HR 25/00318**

An aquarium shop once occupied these two neighbouring properties, until its closure last year. A planning application has since been approved to convert the shop into three bedsit flats, with two one-bedroom flats above.

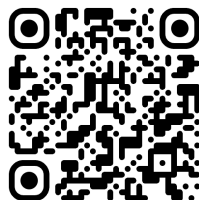

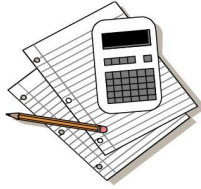
